13 June Thursday £44.00 GREAT COMP GARDEN & NETTLESTEAD PLACE. Great Comp Garden, near Sevenoaks, has built up an enviable reputation over the years as being one of Kent's finest gardens to visit... A tranquil garden space that effortlessly showcases 7 acres of beautiful and rare plants that unfold and flower as the seasons move and change. Home to an Italian Garden, romantic ruins, enchanting woodland walks, The Old Dairy Tearooms and Dyson's Salvias. There will be time to explore and get lunch at Great Comp before we make the short drive to **Nettlestead Place**. Set on the west side of the valley, thus affording panoramic views of the river and surrounding farmland, the gardens are on many levels leading down to the River Medway. In 1921/22 the medieval Manor House was refurbished and enlarged and the basic structure of what is now the inner part of the gardens, including the large sunken pond and the Rose Garden, was established. Nettlestead Place is surrounded by 10 acres of gardens of much beauty interest and variety and were awarded a star rating in the Good Garden's Guide. The features of the gardens have been planned to provide specific and beautiful vistas of open countryside beyond and views of the Manor House, gatehouse and adjoining church. HATFIELD HOUSE. Built by Robert Cecil, 1st Earl of Salisbury and Chief Minister to King James I, from 1607 to 1611. There is a marvellous collection of pictures, furnishings and historic armour on display. The estate has been in the Cecil family for 400 years - one of England's foremost political families. Hatfield House is the home of the 7th Marquess of Salisbury. The Royal Palace of Hatfield (c 1485) in the West Garden is where Elizabeth I spent most of her childhood. In the park, an oak tree marks the place where the young princess Elizabeth first heard of her accession to the throne. The garden at Hatfield House dates from the early 17th Century when Robert Cecil employed John Tradescant the Elder to collect plants for his new home. The West Garden includes a scented garden, herb garden and knot garden. Visitors can enjoy the extensive park surrounding the house. The Coach House Kitchen, Serving breakfast, brunch, lunch and afternoon teas. The seasonal menu includes sustainable produce and monthly specials created by our team of dedicated chefs. 5 September Thursday £43.00 NEW	EMSWORTH AND A PRIVATE CHICHESTER HARBOUR TOUR. Emsworth, located in the far east of Hampshire, is a picturesque old fishing village nestling on the north end of Chichester harbour, with narrow streets, Georgian houses, walled gardens and a mill pond. The village is popular with sailors, artists and naturalists and its stunning waterside views, makes it an attractive place to visit. The small town retains an old world charm and has several architectural styles. It's a great place to walk and browse, with interesting antique shops as well as several independent food shops. In the Middle Ages, Emsworth was a busy port, importing wine for the noble classes. Later the village used tidal power to grind flour and also became known for its oyster beds, boat building, rope making and brewing. The town's oyster production is no more but you can still follow the Oyster Trail, a historic walk starting at the Emsworth Museum. Attractions in Emsworth: The Emsworth Museum in North Street tells the fascinating history of the village, from its most famous resident, P.G. Wodehouse, who incorporated several local names into his books, to the films and oral history recordings made by other local residents. Pleasure boating is now one of Emsworth's main attractions, along with its art galleries and lovely coastal walks, offering views over Chichester Harbour. Food and Drink in Emsworth: Anyone visiting Emsworth will find a

good selection of restaurants, pubs and cafés to choose from. Restaurants such as 36 on the Quay, overlooking the harbour and Fat Olives in a former fisherman's cottage, have enviable reputations, but there are plenty of welcoming hostelries to choose from. **Private 1 hour cruise on The Solar Heritage**. A trip on The Solar Heritage catamaran is a wonderful way to see the harbour as, due to the solar power, she virtually silently glides through the water giving a very serene experience and lovely way to see the local landscape and wildlife. Each sailing offers the opportunity to get up close to many of the birds and habitats that make this place so special. Knowledgeable guides provide commentary whilst you travel. Passengers are welcome to bring refreshments but we ask that **no glass drinking vessels** are brought on board. The boat is very accessible with a large, stable deck, plenty of seating and space to move around and take in the stunning views. There is lift access for anyone with mobility issues.

GREAT MAYTHAM HALL'S SECRET GARDEN AND DAHLIAS AT PASHLEY MANOR. In the early 1900s, American authoress, Frances Hodgson Burnett discovered an iron gate covered in ivy, and beyond it she saw glimpses of an overgrown walled garden. Peeking through the bars at the neglected blooms and tangled vines, a story began to form – of a secret garden waiting to be discovered... The story which followed, The Secret Garden (1911), has become a much-loved children's classic. For over 100 years the garden, hidden inside the grounds of the fictional Misselthwaite Manor, has inspired children and adults alike with its young orphan girl finding a home, and a passion for gardening, within its walls. Follow in the footsteps of Frances Hodgson Burnett and her much-loved cast of characters with a walk through the original secret garden at Great Maytham Hall. There are no refreshments at Great Maytham Hall so suggest you bring a flask. We then make the short drive to Pashley Manor where you can get lunch and enjoy the gardens at leisure. As summer turns to autumn the gardens at Pashley, on the border of Sussex and Kent, are ablaze with colour, provided by thousands of dazzling dahlias, during the Dahlia Days event. Over 70 varieties of this diverse perennial are planted throughout the garden; pinks in the Rose Garden, sunny yellows in the Golden Beds, whites in the Elizabethan Garden, purples in the Pool Garden and more. The pièce de resistance is the hot reds and oranges, interspersed with darker burgundy and complemented by the second flowering of roses, cannot lilies, late flowering perennials and other annuals, in the magnificent herbaceous borders, which are at their best at this time of year. The café, with terrace, serves locally sourced and homemade cakes, scones and light lunches; the shop has gorgeous gifts, souvenirs and plants, and there are exhibitions of garden sculpture and floral art.
