

5 March Wednesday £48.00 EH members £35.50	DOWN HOUSE (EH) AND RAF BIGGIN HILL MEMORIAL MUSEUM AND CHAPEL. With a unique place in the history of science and evolution, Down House was Charles Darwin's family home – and today it is a site of outstanding international significance. Step into the very rooms where Charles Darwin worked and lived, including the study where he wrote On the Origin of Species, and trace his story with a fascinating exhibition about his life and work. The house is surrounded by beautiful gardens that acted as Darwin's 'living laboratory' - see recreated experiments and discover how his observations helped him develop his groundbreaking theories. We have time to explore and get lunch before we move on to RAF Biggin Hill, a small museum that tells the story of RAF Biggin Hill through the personal experiences of those who served there, and the community who supported them. The museum journey begins over 100 years ago when RAF Biggin Hill was just farmland. One of Britain's oldest aerodromes, RAF Biggin Hill is still internationally recognised as Sir Winston Churchill's 'strongest link'. The museum is situated on the same site as St George's RAF Chapel of Remembrance, built in 1951 to preserve the legacy of those who served and died at Biggin Hill during the Second World War. Home 6.00pm 17 April THAMES BARRIER GUIDED VISIT INCLUDING A TEST CLOSURE AND THE THAMES CABLE **CAR.** The Thames Barrier, one of the largest movable flood barriers in the world, spans Thursday 520 metres across the Thames, near Woolwich. Its ten, movable steel gates protect £49.00 125 square kilometres of central London from tidal-surge flooding. When raised, the 3300-tonne main gates stand as high as a five-storey building and as wide as the Including Tour opening of Tower Bridge. The Thames Barrier Information Centre is a small exhibition, and Cable Car. where you can learn how the Thames Barrier was designed, built and works. There is a Limited numbers working model of the Thames Barrier, video on the construction, virtual technical tour allowed. film plus other films and displays about flooding and the environment. Our quides will cover topics including, the history of the river and the risk of flooding in London, the NEW environment and wildlife of the Thames. Our visit coincides with a Test Closure of the Barrier (subject to operational conditions). The tour takes about 90 minutes. There are no refreshment facilities at the barrier so please bring a flask. After our tour we go to O2 where there will be **free time for lunch** (there are plenty of places to eat). We then take The Cable Car, admiring the terrific views, across to The Royal Docks (cafes there as well). There will be time to have a wander around The Royal Docks before returning to the coach at about 15.30 for our homeward journey.



30 April Wednesday £76.00	THE GREAT STINK WITH A BLUE BADGE GUIDE. The day includes a top-notch Blue Badge Tour Guide, a Thames Cruise, the tour at Crossness plus morning coffee and a cup of tea at the end of the afternoon. Two thousand years ago the Romans enjoyed indoor plumbing but until a couple of hundred years ago Londoners were still emptying their chamber pots out of the window. In 1858 the long hot summer turned into The Great Stink with the Thames little more than an open sewer. Something had to be done. We begin in central London tracking London's lost rivers, cruise the Thames to Greenwich and drive across the old Thames marshes to the extraordinary Cathedral of Sewage built to house the Crossness Engines. Bazalgette stopped London's waste running into the Thames by building massive intercepting sewers beneath new Embankments created by pushing back the mighty Thames behind stone walls. On Bazalgette's Victoria Embankment, we board a Thames Pleasure Cruiser to Greenwich. From Greenwich the coach whisks us further east past Woolwich to the Thames Marshes and the Cathedral of Sewage. Discover some of Britain's most spectacular ornamental Victorian cast ironwork and possibly the world's largest surviving beam engines. There's a museum and a social story here too – the workers lived on site in terraced cottages built right above the massive sewage storage tank. Mesh at the windows kept the flies at bay. It must have stunk to high Heaven but my goodness they grew good tomatoes! Please bring a picnic to eat during the cruise.
