MOOR PARK MANSION, RICKMANSWORTH - GUIDED TOUR. This Grade 1 listed Palladian mansion, one of the UK's great architectural treasures, has for over 100 years served as the clubhouse of one of its top golf clubs. Since acquiring the freehold of the estate in 1994 Moor Park Golf Club has invested millions in restoring the building and its exceptional interior and set up The Moor Park Heritage Foundation, whose charitable remit is to ensure the heritage chattels located there are maintained and preserved "for the benefit of the nation at large". One important stipulation in the Foundation's charitable remit is that it must ensure the Mansion is opened to the public on a number of days each year. The Trustees turned to local Arts Societies for help to create the tour experience. In recent years the negotiation of dates with the Club, as well as the management, administration and selling of the public tours, has been led by volunteers from The Arts Society Moor Park. TURNER & CONSTABLE RIVALS & ORIGINALS AT TATE BRITAIN. The definitive exhibition of two pivotal British artists in the 250th year of their births. Two of Britain's greatest painters, J.M.W. Turner and John Constable were also the greatest of rivals. Born within a year of each other – Turner in 1775, Constable in 1776 – the art critics of the day compared their paintings to a clash of 'fire and water'. Turner painted blazing sunsets and sublime scenes from his travels, while Constable often returned to depictions of a handful of beloved places, striving for freshness and authenticity in his portrayal of nature. Marking 250 years since their births, this landmark exhibition explores Turner and Constable's intertwined lives and legacies. Discover unexpected sides to both

The Thames Barrier, one of the largest movable flood barriers in the world, spans 520 metres across the Thames, near Woolwich. Its ten, movable steel gates protect 125 square kilometres of central London from tidal-surge flooding. When raised, the 3300-tonne main gates stand as high as a five-storey building and as wide as the opening of Tower Bridge. The Thames Barrier Information Centre is a small exhibition, where you can learn how the Thames Barrier was designed, built and works. There is a working model of the Thames Barrier, video on the construction, virtual technical tour film plus other films and displays about flooding and the environment. Our guides will cover topics including, the history of the river and the risk of flooding in London, the environment and wildlife of the Thames.
