<p>20 April Monday £50.00</p>	<p>PRIVATE GUIDED TOUR OF STATIONERS HALL, LONDON. The Stationers' Company was officially formed in 1403 as a guild for those in the book trade. This included bookbinders, booksellers and writers. As is often the case in London's history the etymology is interesting. In the medieval period, craftsmen were itinerant, moving around wherever their trade took them. Manuscript writers and illuminators however decided to stay in one place, in the area just North of St Paul's Cathedral. They set up stalls or 'stations', i.e. were stationary, and therefore became known as 'stationers'. Stationery, the items they sold, also got their name from this origin. The Stationers received their Royal Charter in 1557, the only Royal Charter given out by Queen Mary I, sometimes known as 'Bloody Mary'. Today the building is Grade I listed, with many stained glass windows and, as is always the case with livery halls, the walls are covered in paintings of masters, royals and honorary members After our tour you will have free time to get lunch and explore the area which contains many interesting places. St Paul's is opposite and nearby is Paternoster Square & The Guildhall Art Gallery, Fortnum & Mason in The Royal Exchange and you may like to cross the Millenium Bridge to Tate Modern. Twickenham's bohemian past and present, told on a stroll through historic Church Street and the Embankment, overlooking Eel Pie Island. The history of Eel Pie Island tells a fascinating and varied story. From the role it played in the RnB boom of the 60s to its historical boatyards, maverick characters and pioneering spirit of inventive creativity, these fabulous stories are told in the museum, not just on its walls, but also from the first-hand experience of some of its superb volunteers. Boatyards have been a major part of Eel Pie Island's landscape for well over a century, the stories behind the island's boatyards have remained largely untold up until now. We then have free time in Twickenham to get lunch before making our way to Marble Hill. The last complete survivor of the elegant villas and gardens that bordered the Thames</p>

The Old Dairy Café serves hot and cold drinks, tasty light bites and cakes. Indoor and outdoor seating available. Tower: Home to Vita's Writing Room. Vast panoramic views of the formal garden, working farm and 450-acre wider estate from the very top. The Big Room (Library): This atmospheric space was originally used for entertaining by Vita and Harold and is now home to exhibitions throughout the year. We have time in Cranbrook before our visit to Sissinghurst. Known as the 'Capital of the Weald', Cranbrook is a pretty town with a medieval street layout. Many buildings date from the 15th through to the 19th century. Our 2 hours Walton to Hampton Court Boat Trip, passes through two locks and takes you through the beautiful reaches of Sunbury and Hampton (Great views of Hampton Court) and also past Taggs Island and Garrick Temple. The boat also goes through the Desborough Channel to D'Oyly Carte Island and returns to Hampton Court via the meandering old river, past Shepperton Manor, picturesque bungalows and gardens. There is coffee/tea on board. We then drive to Claremont Landscape Gardens. Steeped in nearly 300 years of history, this eighteenth-century garden is a green oasis in the heart of Surrey within easy reach of London. Previously the countryside retreat of queens and heirs, Claremont has always been somewhere to escape everyday life and enjoy simple outdoor pleasures. Many of the great names in landscape design history played a part in the creation of the estate. Over the years Sir John Vanbrugh, Charles Bridgeman, William Kent and 'Capability' Brown all put their own distinctive stamp on the pleasure grounds, and in 1866 Queen Victoria herself acquired the estate to save it from development. Today you can still spot lots of historical features in the garden, including the large turf amphitheatre, serpentine lake, grotto, Camellia Terrace and Belvedere Tower. There is a small café at Claremont but you may prefer to bring a picnic to eat on the coach.</p>

PARSONAGE FARM AND WHITHURST PARK, West Sussex. We went to Parsonage Farm in 2024 and it is stunning. We are revisiting at this more colourful time of year – oh and don't miss the Giraffes! **We enjoy Tea/Coffee on arrival.** The garden's design is based on an C18 concept of ferme ornee – or ornamental farm – with a large lake in a parkland style setting at the front of the house and more formal gardens behind with walks and vistas stretching out into the fields and woodlands. **The garden is now reaching maturity as reflected in the many 12ft yew hedges which divide it into formal and informal areas planted with carefully chosen colour themes and unusual plants.** Avenues are quite a feature – some trained as hedges, pleached allees, hedges on stilts, lollipops – and some in a more natural style such as the tulip tree avenue and hundreds of metres of Holm oaks planted through new woodlands, and underplanted with mahonia, which lead up to a grand grass amphitheatre. Recent developments include the yew cloisters with a statue of balancing stones and rides cut through the woodland. **Please bring a packed lunch to eat on the coach.** Then to **Whithurst Park** 10 mins up the road for about 14.00. **Tea and cake available. The Walled Garden.** The final layout divides the garden into four quarters, with a central pond and fountain, and includes a large Hartley Botanic greenhouse, beautifully kitted out potting sheds and an ingenious automated watering system. The beds at the heart of the two northern quadrants contain Jerusalem artichokes underplanted with strawberries — a nice touch — with quinces and strawberries for the southern ones. Crops are rotated through the four main growing beds and the walls are covered with fan-trained stone fruits. There is also a separate rose garden, parterre and cutting flower bed near the house.
