<p>6 May Wednesday £49.00 Including private visit to the Museum, tea/coffee and walking tour.</p>	<p><b>PRIVATE VISIT TO THE EEL PIE ISLAND MUSEUM with A WALKING TOUR AND MARBLE HILL.</b> Twickenham's bohemian past and present, told on a stroll through historic Church Street and the Embankment, overlooking Eel Pie Island. The history of Eel Pie Island tells a fascinating and varied story. From the role it played in the RnB boom of the 60s to its historical boatyards, maverick characters and pioneering spirit of inventive creativity, <b>these fabulous stories are told in the museum, not just on its walls, but also from the first-hand experience of some of its superb volunteers.</b> The stories behind the island's boatyards have remained largely untold up until now. <b>We then have free time in Twickenham to get lunch</b> before making our way to <b>Marble Hill</b>. Inside the house, you can discover a taste of Georgian life with freshly conserved interiors and new displays that tell the story of Henrietta Howard, Marble Hill's remarkable owner. Outside, explore over 60 acres of riverside parkland, with restored gardens, reinvigorated woods and even a nine-pin bowling alley. Designed in a series of 'rooms' with highlights including the Rose Garden and the White Garden. Discover why Sissinghurst is famous as the epitome of the English garden and explore its series of garden rooms, each filled with different planting schemes and unique designs. <b>The Old Dairy Café</b> serves hot and cold drinks, tasty light bites and cakes. Indoor and outdoor seating available. <b>Tower:</b> Home to Vita's Writing Room. Vast panoramic views of the formal garden, working farm and 450-acre wider estate from the very top. <b>The Big Room (Library):</b> This atmospheric space was originally used for entertaining by Vita and Harold and is now home to exhibitions throughout the year. <b>We have time in Cranbrook before our visit to Sissinghurst.</b> Known as the '<b>Capital of the Weald</b>', Cranbrook is a pretty town with a medieval street layout. Many buildings date from the 15th through to the 19th century. This historic town is a perfect place to see the Wealden lifestyle in a beautiful setting. <p>18 May Monday £48.00 NT members £63.00 Non NT members. <b>Separate cheque please if paying by cheque.</b> <b>Only one space left.</b></p>	<p><b>THAMES CRUISE AND CLAREMONT LANDSCAPE GARDENS (NT).</b> Our 2 hours Walton to Hampton Court Boat Trip, passes through two locks and takes you through the beautiful reaches of Sunbury and Hampton (Great views of Hampton Court) and also past Taggs Island and Garrick Temple. The boat also goes through the Desborough Channel to D'Oyly Carte Island and returns to Hampton Court via the meandering old river, past Shepperton Manor, picturesque bungalows and gardens. There is coffee/tea on board. We then drive to <b>Claremont Landscape Gardens</b>. Steeped in nearly 300 years of history, this eighteenth-century garden is a green oasis in the heart of Surrey within easy reach of London. Previously the countryside retreat of queens and heirs, Claremont has always been somewhere to escape everyday life and enjoy simple outdoor pleasures. Many of the great names in landscape design history played a part in the creation of the estate. <p>21 May Thursday £60.00</p>	<p><b>PARSONAGE FARM AND WHITHURST PARK, West Sussex.</b> We went to Parsonage Farm in 2024 and it is stunning. We are revisiting at this more colourful time of year – oh and don't miss the Giraffes! <b>We enjoy Tea/Coffee on arrival.</b> The garden's design is based on an C18 concept of ferme ornee – or ornamental farm – with a large lake in a parkland style setting at the front of the house and more formal gardens behind with walks and vistas stretching out into the fields and woodlands. Recent developments include the yew cloisters with a statue of balancing stones and rides cut through the woodland. <b>Please bring a packed lunch to eat on the coach.</b> Then to <b>Whithurst Park</b> 10 mins up the road for about 14.00. Tea and cake available. <b>The Walled Garden.</b> The final layout divides the garden into four quarters, with a central pond and fountain, and includes a large Hartley Botanic greenhouse, beautifully kitted out potting sheds and an ingenious automated watering system. The beds at the heart of the two northern quadrants contain Jerusalem artichokes underplanted with strawberries — a nice touch — with quinces and strawberries for the southern ones. Crops are rotated through the four main growing beds and the walls are covered with fan-trained stone fruits. There are also a separate rose garden, parterre and cutting flower bed near the house. Visitors to the gardens in the summer months can see the recently renovated long herbaceous borders. Half the border has been replanted in the original pink and blue planting scheme first used by the late Christopher Lloyd when he first designed the border at Hole Park. The remainder of the border was replanted using the original colour scheme of yellow and white. 2 September Wednesday £65.00 <b>NEW</b>	<b>HIGHCLERE CASTLE, GARDENS AND EGYPTIAN EXHIBITION.</b> The first written records of the estate date back to 749AD when an Anglo-Saxon King granted the estate to the Bishops of Winchester. Bishop William of Wykeham built a beautiful medieval palace and gardens in the park. Later on, in 1679, the palace was rebuilt as Highclere Place House when it was purchased by Sir Robert Sawyer, the direct ancestor of the current Earl of Carnarvon. In 1842, Sir Charles Barry, who also designed the Houses of Parliament, transformed Highclere House into the present day Highclere Castle. During the First World War, Highclere Castle was converted into a hospital for wounded soldiers run by the 5th Countess of Carnarvon. Then, in the Second World War, Highclere Castle was home to children evacuated from London. There are between 250 and 300 rooms in the Castle Saloon and during your tour you will explore the main state rooms so familiar from "Downton Abbey". You will see some of the bedrooms after which you will follow the stairs down to the cellars and old staff quarters where you will find the Egyptian Exhibition, celebrating the 5th Earl of Carnarvon's discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun. Records show the gardens were first developed here during the 13th century. Today you are welcome to explore the original Monk's Garden, the Secret Garden, the White Border, the Wood of Goodwill, the Rose Arbour, the Wild Flower Meadow and, nearer the Castle, the Healing Herb garden. On your visit you will have a free flow tour of the Castle, visit The Egyptian Exhibition and have time to
